Enrollment and Retention Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Toledo Campus Architectural program enrollment is up 22 students to 108. Findlay Campus is down 2 students to 15. ▪ The Architectural CAD Operator Certificate is no longer being offered. ▪ The Construction Inspector Certificate has seven students enrolled this fall. It is not a certification program, but does give students information needed to become an inspector. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The College is getting a wind generator. There is potential for a possible partnership with the manufacturer to provide training in this area. It also gives the College visibility and marketability.

Adjunct faculty member Mel Mull has been ill and substitutes are covering his classes. He plans to return in the spring. She has a bachelor's degree from Baldwin-Wallace College and prefers scheduling her own classes. Kristin is giving consideration to obtaining a master's degree.

Program and Curriculum Enhancements	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The total number of required credit hours for the program was reduced last year to 67. The Math Department implemented MTH 128 and was supposed to come up with MTH 228 to cover the School of Technology requirements for analytical geometry, trigonometry and calculus. MTH 228 is not on the schedule yet.• Reed Knowles is concerned that students are not getting the level of Microsoft Word and Excel they need in the EET 130 class.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tech Math II can be substituted until MTH 228 is developed. There is a possibility that the School of Technology may need to go back to Tech Math I and Tech Math II. If that is the case, the program total credit hours would go up to 69, which is still less than before.
