Enrollment and Retention Report	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Enrollment in the Toledo Campus program is down two students from last fall semester for a total of 13. ▪ Enrollment in the Quality Assurance Certificate is also down two students for a total of 6. ▪ School of Technology enrollments are up 9.3% this semester. ▪ The Black Belt and Green Belt classes don't have any students right now, but several graduate each semester. ▪ A list of all the QCT classes running this semester and the number of students in each class was distributed. There are 17 class sections with the average of 11 students in each class. ▪ Dr. Sinn gave a presentation at the Chrysler machining plant this week that focused on the Baccalaureate 3 + 1 program. The residual hours can be taken at any community college. Dr. Sinn believes that the School of Technology needs to be involved in this. ▪ Dr. Sinn wants to involve the ASQ in student portfolio reviews. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ It was suggested that the list showing the number of students in currently running classes be provided at all future meetings since it more accurately reflects how the program is doing.

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<p>Program and Curriculum Enhancements</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ QCT 202 Continuous Improvement & TQM ran for the first time as a web course this semester. ▪ QCT 110 SQC went on-line over the summer with close to 20 students. Registration for spring started two weeks ago and this class is almost full already. ▪ Myron Bowers is working to get more of the Quality courses on-line. ▪ A CQE Refresher course is on the schedule for spring. Anyone interested in taking it should be referred to the Owens web site. Myron Bowers volunteered to teach the class, if it runs. ▪ Mark Schoenlein would like to give a survey to students to find out where their interests lie. This survey could be part of the exploratory AIM 105 Systems of Engineering and Integrated Systems class. This class is being introduced at the high school level and is being taught at Central Catholic this semester. Sophomores are exposed to all the SOT disciplines to give them a better idea of what career path to follow 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The QCT 105 Technology and Society course has been changed to two credit hours. Additional material will be added to this course starting summer and fall 2008. ▪ It was suggested that a general class be offered to review for the CQE and CQT, since there are many parts that are similar. ▪ A suggestion was made to offer a class where different companies could come in to share how things are done at their particular company.

Jim Gilmore will check with the lab technician to see if the wireless network for room 156 can be moved up to the first line so students will pick the right one.
