PROGRAM INFORMATION

This program prepares students for entry- and supervisory-level positions in firms that provide maintenance and management services in the landscape, turfgrass and related horticultural industries. The rapidly growing markets for these services offer excellent opportunities for graduates. If you love being outside, working with your hands, and seeing the results of a day's work, this is the field for you! Many students become passionate about plants and improving the environment.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATES

Students graduating from this program may find positions in the landscape field such as landscape designer, landscape installation, landscape construction and grounds maintenance. Employers include; landscape companies, arboretums, zoo's, gardens, municipalities, golf courses, and athletic fields. Plant nurseries and greenhouses have positions in production, pest management, shipping and sales. Garden centers also offer opportunities. Some graduates start their own landscape installation or maintenance business and some continue on for their bachelor's degree at a four-year university.

SALARY

Starting pay varies based on chosen field, experience, and willingness to re-locate. Some examples of salaries include:

Crew Supervisor (maintenance/installation) \$30,000 - \$38,000/year

Foreman (maintenance/installation/nursery production) \$35,000 - \$50,000/year

Golf Course Superintendent \$35,000 - \$62,000/year

Production/Operations Manager \$40,000 - \$70,000/year

TECH PREP SCHOLARSHIP

Owens Community College offers Tech Prep scholarships to graduating high school seniors who have participated in a Tech Prep career pathway within the Greater Northwest Ohio Tech Prep Consortium. The maximum award is \$2,000 total (\$1,000 per year) or \$500 per semester for four semesters to cover tuition, fees, and an allotment for books **that are not covered** by other financial aid, such as Federal Pell Grant, as long as the student maintains eligibility. This scholarship does not pay for supplies, lab fees, course fees, and other institutional fees. Students must earn a 2.5 on a 4.0 GPA scale by the end of the 7th semester of high school. They must enroll at Owens, full time, for the fall semester immediately following high school graduation, and declare an associate degree program related to the chosen high school Tech Prep pathway.
