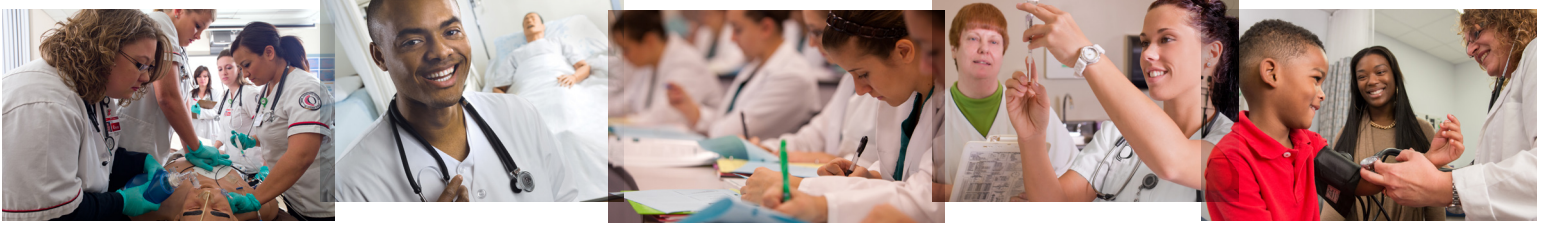


SELECTIVE PROGRAMS EVALUATION DEADLINES 2017-2018

(Criteria as of August 15, 2017)



Thank you for your interest in Owens Community College selective health programs. These programs have selective admission requirements. Please work with your advisor regarding your program of interest. For appointment scheduling please contact (567) 661-2387 in Toledo and (567) 429-3509 in Findlay. You can find your advisor in Ozone by clicking "My Advisor."

If you were previously evaluated and denied, and wish to be re-evaluated for the same program or any other program, it is your responsibility to complete the "Request for Health Evaluation" in your Ozone account. Results of the evaluation will be sent to your OMAIL about 1-2 weeks from the complete file deadline date. The number of days that applicants

will have to respond to the email regarding their selective admissions status and accept/decline a seat will be 7 days for all programs. Applicants will be able to accept a seat in only one program, but an unlimited number of seats as an alternate.

**Please note all high school level course requirements must be at least 1 credit. All science courses must contain a lab section.

A complete file is needed before an evaluation can occur. Track file completion under "My Required Documents" in your Ozone account.

Dental Assisting and Medical Coding have been removed from Selective Health programming. Please see your advisor for details.

REGISTERED NURSING PROGRAM

Needed for complete file:

- Application
- Graduation from high school or successful completion of the GED (General Education Development) test is required. High school students may apply, but continuation in the program may be contingent upon submission of an official high school transcript verifying graduation.
- Official transcripts are required from any college or university attended.
- A grade of "C" or better in one of the following: one full credit of high school level chemistry, CHM 095, a higher level college chemistry course or PHY 115.
- A grade of "C" or better in one of the following: one full credit of high school level anatomy, biology, anatomy & physiology, BIO 101, BIO 201, BIO 202, BIO 211, or BIO 212.
- Completion of the ACT or SAT.
- The first attempt of the most recent version of all four components of TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills).
- Some programs require observation hours.
- Some programs require an Ohio Department of Health approved Nurse Assistant Training Competency Evaluation Program (NATCEP) completed within two years of the beginning of the first SNHP Program clinical course.

Deadline Dates

August 15, 2017 for Spring 2018; January 15, 2018 for Fall 2018; August 15, 2018 for Spring 2019
RN accepts 105 students per class in Toledo and 35 in Findlay.

PRACTICAL NURSING CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Needed for complete file:

- Application
- High school/GED transcript
- College transcript(s)
- Evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better
- Successful completion of the TEAS test (50% or higher on all 4 parts)
- 2.0 overall Owens Community College cumulative grade point average

Deadline Dates

August 15, 2017 for Spring 2018 for Findlay and January 15, 2018 for Fall 2018 for Toledo; August 15, 2018 for Spring 2019 for Findlay
PN accepts 28 students per class.

LPN/ADN PROGRESSION PROGRAM

Needed for complete file:

- Application
- High school/GED transcript
- LPN transcript
- College transcript(s)
- Evidence of high school biological science course and chemistry with a "C" grade or better
- Completion of the TEAS test (first attempt only of the most recent version)
- Completion of the HESI PN-ADN exam (first attempt only)

Deadline Dates

August 15, 2017 (Toledo Only-Spring 2018), January 15, 2018 (Findlay only, Fall 2018), August 15, 2018 (Toledo Only-Spring 2019)
LPN/ADN accepts 40 students per class in Toledo and 24 in Findlay.

Deadline Dates

Dental Hygiene, HIT, Medical Assisting, OTA, and Surgical Tech all have a deadline date of January 15, 2018 for Fall 2018.

PTA has a deadline date of June 15, 2018 for Fall 2018

MIT (RAD, MRI, & Diagnostic General Sonography (General and Vascular Concentrations) all have a deadline date (Step 1) of January 15, 2018 for a Summer 2018 and Step 2 March 15, 2018 for Summer 2018 start.

If you desire to be considered for any program(s) housed within the Medical Imaging Technologies (MIT) Department you must first be accepted into the department (Step One), and then additional requirements are necessary to be awarded a seat in your program of interest (Step Two). When you have met the admission requirements for acceptance to the department you will be sent an e-mail to your Owens Community College e-mail account that requires you to call the Medical Imaging Technologies (MIT) Department Office to schedule an appointment with the Chair. After meeting with the Chair, you will be required to complete one or more 8 hour visits to local health care agencies to observe the various imaging modalities in which they have an interest. Following the observations, you must return a response card requesting to be evaluated for the specific MIT program(s) of your choice (Step Two). All MIT programs begin in the Summer. It is highly recommended that students in Radiography complete PHY 211 Radiologic Physics prior to the In Program start date.

Admission to all Selective programs is competitive. Students are ranked by the points obtained by the evaluation. Students earning the highest number of points are invited to accept a position in the program of their choice. After completion of the evaluations, students are sent an e-mail to their Owens Community College e-mail account that requires them to accept a seat in the program of their choice. Students have 7 days to respond to this email. The number of students accepted is limited by clinical availability.

Dental Hygiene accepts 25 students per class.

General Sonography accepts 14 students per class.

HIT accepts 25 students per class.

Magnetic Resonance accepts 15 students per class.

OTA accepts 28 students per class.

PTA accepts 26 students per class.

Radiography accepts 40 students per class.

Surgical accepts 20 students per class.

Vascular Sonography accepts 10 students per class.



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
