

HEALTH TECHNOLOGIES ADMISSIONS EVALUATION DEADLINES 2004-2005

To be evaluated for admission into a health program, you must have a **complete file** in the Records Office by the deadline dates listed below. ***Evaluation does not mean automatic admission to a specific program.*** All health programs have selective admissions. Students cannot begin clinical coursework within the program until they are accepted in that program. Prior to acceptance into the clinical coursework, most students complete coursework required for Arts and Science electives in a program. **In Dietetic, HIT, OTA, PTA, and Medical Imaging, PHY115 is a helpful course in a number of ways. It is important to check this with an academic advisor.**

REGISTERED NURSING

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall and Spring Semesters on both the Toledo-area and Findlay Campuses. The deadline for a complete file is **May 19, August 11, October 6, November 23, December 17, 2004, March 2, May 18, August 10, 2005**. Registered Nursing accepts 105 students each semester in Toledo and 35 students each semester in Findlay.

Students who do not qualify for direct admission upon evaluation of their file must complete a series of courses in science and general education and submit a **"Request for Evaluation Form"** prior to re-evaluation. A complete file for these "Pre-Nursing" students includes a 2.6 GPA in BIO211, 212, and 231; and a 2.6 GPA in ENG 111, 112, and PSY 260. The deadline for course completion and a complete file is the last day of class each semester.

LPN/ADN

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED transcripts, LPN transcript, college transcripts, evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better, and 2.0 overall college GPA. Classes begin Fall Semester on the Toledo-area Campus and Summer Semester on the Findlay Campus each year. The deadline for a complete file is **May 19, August 11, October 6, November 23, December 17, 2004, March 2, May 18, August 10, 2005**. Prior to the first nursing class, students must provide evidence of pharmacology certification. LPN/ADN accepts 40 students per class in Toledo and 24 in Findlay.

LPN PROGRAM

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED transcripts, college transcripts, evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better, proof of successful completion of a Nurse's Aide Training course, successful completion of the ATI Test, and 2.0 overall college GPA. Classes begin Spring and Fall Semesters on both the Toledo-area and Findlay Campuses each year. The deadline for a complete file is **May 19, August 11, October 6, November 23, December 17, 2004, March 2, May 18, August 10, 2005**. Evaluations will continue until seats are filled. The LPN Program accepts 28 students per class for each semester.

DENTAL HYGIENE

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester each year. The deadline for a complete file is **February 2, 2005**. Evaluation will continue until seats are filled. Dental Hygiene accepts 30 students per class.

DIETETIC TECHNOLOGY

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and evidence of high school algebra with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester each year. The deadline for a complete file is **June 2, July 7, August 4, September 22, November 17, 2004, January 12, March 30, June 1, July 6, August 3, 2005**. Evaluation will continue until seats are filled. Dietetic accepts 24 students per class.

PHYSICAL THERAPY ASSISTANT – Online and Web

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester each year. The deadline for a complete file is **February 4, 2005**. Evaluation will continue until seats are filled. PTA accepts 25 students per class.

HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY / MEDICAL CODING CERTIFICATE / MEDICAL REIMBURSEMENT SPECIALIST CERTIFICATE

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT/SAT scores (**NOT required for Medical Reimbursement Specialist certificate**), evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester each year. The deadline for a complete file is **June 2, July 7, August 4, September 22, November 17, 2004, January 12, March 30, June 1, July 6, August 3, 2005**. Evaluations will continue until seats are filled. HIT accepts 25 students per class and both certificate programs accept 50 students per class. **An 18 or higher ACT composite score or 850 or higher combined SAT score is required for the Medical Coding Certificate.**

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT/SAT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester each year. The deadline for a complete file is **June 2, July 7, August 4, September 22, November 17, 2004, January 12, March 30, June 1, July 6, August 3, 2005**. Evaluation will continue until seats are filled. OTA accepts 30 students per class.

SURGICAL

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. Classes begin Fall Semester. The deadline for a complete file is **June 2, July 7, August 4, September 22, November 17, 2004, January 12, March 30, June 1, July 6, August 3, 2005**. Evaluation will continue until all seats are filled. Surgical accepts 24 students per class.

MEDICAL IMAGING TECHNOLOGIES

A complete file includes: an application, high school/GED and college transcripts, ACT scores, and evidence of high school algebra and chemistry with a "C" grade or better. The deadline for complete file is **June 2, August 11, September 22, November 10, 2004, January 12, March 9, June 1, August 10, 2005**.

Upon evaluation of a file, if a high school or college applicant does not meet the criteria for acceptance into Medical Imaging Technologies, the applicant is encouraged to meet with the chair or Health Admissions staff to complete specific Arts and Science courses as published in the College Catalog.

After acceptance into Medical Imaging Technologies, students must complete an interview with the chair, observation in a clinical site, and choose a major in Nuclear Medicine, Radiography, or Diagnostic Medical Sonography. Those selecting Nuclear Medicine or Radiography will be assigned to the next available seat in those programs which begin Summer and Spring semesters each year. Nuclear Medicine accepts 9 students in June and January. Radiography accepts 20 students in January and 20 students in June.

DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHY

Admission into this major is competitive. Once a student has been accepted into Medical Imaging Technologies, completed an interview with the chair and a field observation, and returned a response card, the student will be considered for the major evaluation held once each year in March. At that time, any seats available for Summer Semester of that year will be awarded. An applicant is evaluated by high school GPA, Math/Science GPA, and ACT scores. An applicant who has completed 12 credit hours of college coursework with a minimum of four hours in math and/or science will be evaluated on college credit hours completed, college GPA, college math/science GPA and ACT scores.

The deadline for a complete file for first-time applicants is **January 12, 2005**. A first-time applicant has applied for admission and has a complete file, but has not been accepted into the Medical Imaging Technologies.

The deadline for a student who desires evaluation for the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program, who has previously been accepted into Medical Imaging Technologies, and has completed the interview and field observation, is **March 9, 2005**. Sonography accepts 12 students per class.
