OSCC Raises Consumer Spending



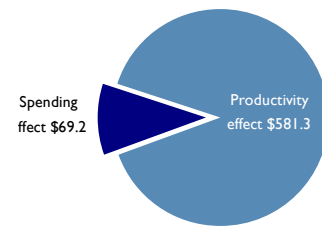
- OSCC employed 663 full-time and 1,059 part-time faculty and staff during FY 2007-08, with an annual payroll of \$66.3 million.
- OSCC had a total operating budget of \$103.8 million, of which \$73.1 million (or 70%) was spent in the service area.
- Approximately 26% of OSCC’s student body came from outside the service area. These students generated an estimated \$2.3 million in local sales while attending OSCC.

OSCC Stimulates Economic Growth

- OSCC spending for supplies and services and the expenditures of out-of-area students in FY 2007-08 generated a net impact of \$69.2 million in added income in the economy.
- The increased productivity of area workers due to the accumulation of past and present OSCC skills in the workforce contributed approximately \$581.3 million in added income in FY 2007-08.

Income Growth Due to OSCC

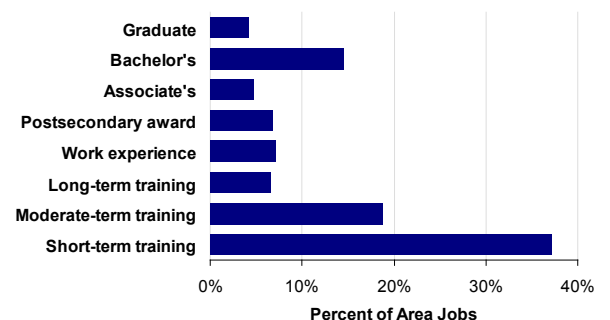
(amounts in millions)



OSCC Creates a Skilled Workforce

- OSCC activities encourage new business, assist existing business, and create long-term economic growth. The college enhances worker skills and provides customized training to local business and industry.
- It is estimated that in FY 2007-08 the OSCC Service Area workforce embodied about 2.4 million credit hours of past and present OSCC training. These added skills promote business productivity and increase income in the area.
