- Be a resident of the City of Toledo.
- Must have household income at or below 80% Area Median Income adjusted for family size and provide proof of income.
- Be at least 21 years old.
- Have been continually employed for 6 months or longer and are currently working 30-40 hours per week or combined employment and college credit hours (at least 20 hours required employment).
- Must have a fair credit history or better. Be able to afford a \$150 monthly payment.
- Have a good driving record and valid driver's license.
- Not currently having a vehicle titled in your name or any other household member's name, or having only one vehicle titled in your name or any other household member's name that has high mileage and high repair costs.
