

EARN COLLEGE CREDIT!

Enrolling in Post-Secondary Option courses now may provide both high school and college credit. College credit that is awarded may be used at Owens Community College or for transfer to a college or university of choice after high school graduation.

Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSO)

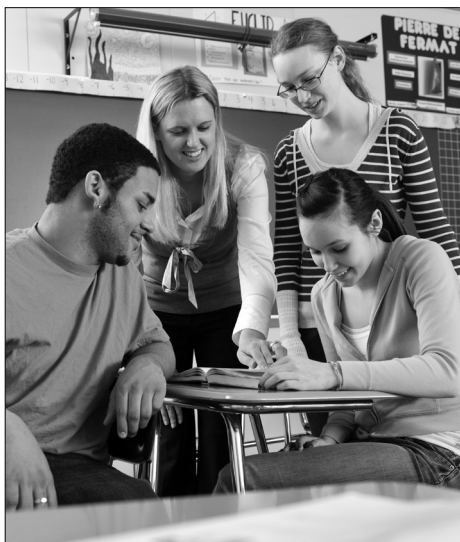
Students may enroll in classes on the Toledo-area campus, Findlay-area campus, online, or take selected Post-Secondary Enrollment Options classes at an area high school.

Students have TWO CHOICES:

Option A – Students may receive only college or both high school and college credit. The student is responsible for tuition, fees and books.

Option B – Students enroll for high school and college credit and the tuition, fees and book expenses are paid for by the state and the high school. The student is responsible for all course materials beyond text and workbooks.

Textbooks are the property of the College. You may purchase books if you plan to keep them.



Application Requirements

1. Students must complete the eighth grade.
2. Students must complete application materials for the PSO program and submit them to the Owens Records Office. Materials include the PSO application, the High School Information Form, the Parent Signature Form, and a high school transcript. An online application is available at www.owens.edu/pso.
3. Students must receive passing scores on the Owens placement test for recommendation into college-level classes. The placement test may be waived if the student has achieved the following or better on the ACT: Reading (22), English (18) or Math (22).
4. Students cannot enroll in a specific college course if they took high school courses in the same subject area as that college course and failed to achieve a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
5. The registration deadline for PSO students for Fall Semester 2012 is July 27, 2012. The registration deadline for Post-Secondary students for the Spring Semester 2013 is December 14, 2012. Once registered, PSO students must get permission from their high school to add or drop classes.
6. Applicants agree to abide by all the policies and procedures of Owens as well as any specific to this program. Students and their parents or a guardian are required to participate in a college orientation program.
7. Students must achieve an overall GPA of a 2.0 or higher in college coursework at Owens to enroll in sequential semesters. Students may re-apply to the program by submitting a new high school information form and meeting with an Owens PSO advisor.

How to Apply and Register

1. Complete and submit the online PSO application at www.owens.edu/pso
2. Meet with your high school guidance counselor to complete the High School Information Form. Copies of this form can be printed from www.owens.edu/pso
3. Complete and sign the Parent Signature Form. Copies of this form can be printed from www.owens.edu/pso

5. Take a placement test provided at Owens or have scores on the ACT that waive the placement test. Please call (567) 661-8378 for an appointment.
6. Upon acceptance, make an appointment for academic advising and registration. Contact the Advising Office on the campus you plan to attend. Toledo (567) 661-7777, Findlay (567) 429-3509.
